
Would you be comfortable with the Beracah Choir leading 11:10AM worship without robes?


Would you be willing to worship at a different time if this were deemed crucial to the congregation and it was discussed and voted on at Congregational Council?


Which of the following statements comes the closest to your view of the use of hymns in worship?






How often would you like to sing new or unfamiliar songs (hymns, songs, or choruses) in worship? (Choose 1)


How many non-congregational music presentations should be in the Sunday morning service? (Choose 1)

#18 - 'traditional hymns' whose tradition?

Many of the 'traditional' hymns are like funeral dirges and the wording is ancient.

I 'believe' the major-major portion of our congregation are birth right (many-many generations) Moravian. This means the strong (almost egotistical) tradition of music is a least equal to message is core to "Moravian" soul. New birthright Moravians do not have this in their worship genes.

Worship is the corporate community gathering. A warm, friendly, smile and words to regular visitors and newbies create an accepting, loving atmosphere for our corporate worship hour.

Holding on to tradition in a changing world environment and church population is difficult and has been for over 2000 years. The 'old' have to yield to the new and the new yield to the old, a balance is our challenge.

NPMC overall, in this environment, is doing ok. To push to far in either direction can be bad, in that it pops some people out of the box to bring others in.

All 'traditional' established churches of all denomination are going through some process, Moravians are 'deeper' in tradition. The smaller population and regional factors encourage holding fast.

This 'stong' tradition and history has an appeal to some. It also emphasizes or isolates those non-birthright members to being converts to the truth. It's just a fact we have got to be sensitive to and

live with all establish churches have same problem, Moravians are just more entrenched.

Recognition of newbies with a warm friendship smile is welcoming. Better signage and give road map to church - simple one page handout to church 'floor' plan.

Volunteer worship, welcome committee (you don't have to wear suit and tie type)

The extensive use of praise choruses in the 2nd service concerns me. Many of our children attend that service. Will they know the traditional hymns later in life?

Great church. Beautiful services that have become known throughout surrounding communities and even adopted by others. Good people. I hope truth from the scriptures and Jesus Christ (not political correctness, fear of offending, or not gaining members fast enough) will always be the focus for this beautiful church. An "Ask the Pastor" section posted on the church website might be nice if pastor Green has time to pick one from those submitted and respond to it once or twice a month--with the submitter remaining anonymous to the rest of the congregation. And as long as it doesn't turn into a "complaint box" of sorts. But I realize he's so very busy already. Thank you for the opportunity to respond to this survey.

Change is inevitable for any organization to grow and flourish. It may be small changes or big changes, but staying the same (even if it fits our comfort zone very well) will not make us a more dynamic congregation reaching others with the examples of Christ and his boundless love. We have a church van and several apartment complexes within a mile or so radius, not to mention the surrounding single family homes. Why aren't we reaching out and sending the van to provide transportation? And, yes, I know we may only get the children and that may make us free baby sitters in a sense, but how wonderful would it be to have many young ones at our church every Sunday learning about the love of God? And reach the children and make them feel welcome and important, and the parents will follow. And yes, I know that this will take a lot of work, but I'm willing if a few others are as well. I'll pass out fliers, learn to drive the van, teach Sunday School, etc. We could also make our church a place where those with special needs feel welcome and accommodated. How about a Sunday School class for children with special needs? It would take planning and we would need to have someone on hand with qualifications to oversee its function, but other churches have done this successfully and we can too. I would like to see a welcoming committee at every service to identify visitors and help them in any way necessary (finding a Sunday School class, etc. and follow up with contact the next week by phone, mail, etc.). Concerning the worship service - we are blessed to have a senior pastor who gives us wonderful sermons and teachings as do others who take the pulpit. But there are other things we can do to make the services interesting and dynamic without abandoning the wonderful Moravian traditions that we cherish, whether new to the denomination or a life long member. Give youth ongoing roles in ushering, prayers, music, an occasional sermon, etc. And make them feel important. One thing I hear regularly is that the youth do not feel as if they are important to the church. This may not be true, but if that is their perception, then it might as well be. Vary the music in the types of hymns we sing, the choral groups sing and the band plays without losing the Moravian music tradition so important to many. Make a real effort to expand the talent. There is a lot of talent in

the church, but we only hear a few folks featured. And while this is a blessing to have, let's expand that to others who can be a blessing, too. It would be nice to have featured instruments in the band prelude or during worship services and the bell choir is so beautiful, they should be heard more often. I don't know why they were left off this survey. I would like to see more attention paid to the larger community and its issues. We are very committed to Sunnyside, Laurel Ridge, and feeding the hungry and that's as it should be at least to Sunnyside and feeding the hungry. Laurel Ridge is important to the Moravian Church as it is to many at NPMC, but not to everyone and it isn't accessible or convenient for many. I am happy to support its maintenance but have heard more than I need to about the slab. It would help if I understood why that is so important. It is my belief that home missions are just as important as other missions and we should learn more about community challenges and how we can make a real difference in addressing them. We can't be all things to all people, but we can expand our knowledge and understanding. I have no desire to belong to a mega-church. If I did I wouldn't be at NPMC. But I would like to be a member of a thriving and dynamic congregation committed to sharing the love of God and the messages of Jesus through outreach and action.

The Moravian faith has always been based on "simplicity, consistency, and humility." In recent times, we have lost sight of these traits. We need to get back to these instead of trying to embrace so many changes in order to be "all things to all people."

I like the combination of traditional liturgical worship with contemporary music.
