Quarterly Trustees Report

I'm thrilled to announce that once again this congregation stepped up to the challenge. We eliminated the entire Church Fund deficit in December through your extraordinary giving. Donna just closed the books, and we ended the year with a \$0 Church Fund deficit for 2023.

This is OUR Church and we proved that as a Congregation.

Even with this fantastic news, it's also appropriate to turn our attention to how we avoid these large deficits in the future.

The weekly Bulletin will be updated at the end of every month to reflect our year-to-date Church Fund surplus or deficit.

If we are running a surplus, then our collective tithing is supporting the essential needs of the Church.

If we are running a deficit, then we need to react immediately and increase our Church Fund contributions. Remember just \$5 a week from all our active members in 2023 would've avoided carrying a deficit into December. Everything counts.

Historical patterns indicate that July, August, September, and October are our weakest months for Church Fund tithing. Keep that in mind and be very diligent during our summer months.

Historical patterns indicate that September, October, and November are some of our highest Church Fund expense months of the year. If we're running a surplus at a given time in 2024 that doesn't mean our current tithing will carry us through the remainder of the year. It's always a balance.

2023 4th Quarter Highlights and Other News:

Our total designated funds balance grew by over \$11,000 in 2023.

The Technology Team met a few months ago and because of generous donations to the Michael Crotts Technology Fund we've improved our streaming equipment, capabilities, and sound/video quality. The Church will have a dedicated fiber internet service starting in January 2024, we replaced the projector in the fellowship hall, and we'll continue with other initiatives in Q1 of 2024. Many people helped this process over the last 60 days. Special thanks to Bob Saturn and Frank Nifong for going above and beyond to lend their time and talents.

New Philadelphia has provided over \$50,000 in general and cancer benevolence relief to our local community in 2023 while Missions and Outreach spending from New Philadelphia is over \$80,000 so far this year.

The Board of Trustees had 4 individuals who completed their 3-year terms last month.

Darlene Reinhardt: Darlene served as the Board Secretary for two years, created a vital link to our Women's Fellowship group, and contributed her time and talents to many areas of our Church including creating a comprehensive policy and guide on gift giving to New Philadelphia.

Dan Franklin: Dan is our Head Usher which is a huge job by itself. He added insight (and some humor) to many important topics discussed over the last 3 years. Dan's passion for our Church is very evident, and his commitment to ministries including the Elizabeth Windsor Fund was a huge asset.

John Geis: John's background in Purchasing and his current role as Head of the Missions Commit-

tee was invaluable to the Board over the last 3 years. His wealth of knowledge from decades of service at New Philadelphia helped us work through some difficult and complex issues and topics. Since Missions are a big focus for our Church, John's service on the Board of Trustees helped all of our outreach efforts.

Steve Huddleston: Steve served as the Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees in 2023. He was the Representative to our Preschool and Youth Committees, and he ran the annual Church Audit for the last few years. His service to the Church included a lot of his time, and that always came with his passion for New Philadelphia and our future. His contributions and voice will be missed.

Please thank these four outgoing Board members when you have a chance. Thank you.

Classes being offered for 24-25 school year:

- •Infants (2-5 days)
- •Toddlers (2-5 days)
- •Twos (3 or 5 days)
- •Threes (3 or 5 days)
- •Fours (5 days)
- •Fives/Readiness (5 days)

Class placement is based on the child's age on August 31st of the current year. Infants must be 3 months old by August 31st, toddlers must be 1 by that date, and so forth. Certain exceptions will be made on a case by case basis.

Once registration has been submitted, you will receive an email invoice for the registration fee (\$150 for one child, \$250 for two or more children).

South Fork Ministry News

South Fork Ministry started the fall off with our Second Apple Day with apples from Levering Or-

chard in Virginia for all of the scholars, faculty and staff at South Fork plus the staff at the NPMC Preschool. The scholars from South Fork wrote and drew thank you notes to Frank Levering for their treats. The faculty at South Fork are teaching gratitude in conjunction with the daily curriculum.

In November, South Fork held their first Dolphin

Fall Family Feast. Janet Gardner, Bill Donald, Jerrie Andrews, Valerie Crane, Elizabeth and Jack Long, and Bill and Marla Sparks helped with this event. All South Fork families were invited to a free dinner, but had to rsvp. There was a taco bar (from Mi Pueblo) and a salad bar and traditional Thanksgiving meal (from Golden Corral) for the guests. South Fork hopes through events like this,

that their families will bond with one another and with the school faculty and staff. Dr. Green-Hughes thanked New Philadelphia for our support for this event and throughout the year.

Also in November, Thanksgiving meals were provided for many families. Due to Emily McNeil's organization and the generous donations of food and time, the

Thanksgiving Project reached out to several schools and served 55 families. The preschool families helped also with rolls of paper towels for all of the families. (these cannot be purchased by EBT funds). Boxes were packed in record time on Sunday, November 19 and loaded on the Holly

Poultry refrigerated truck. On Monday, November 20 food was delivered by several drivers to 3 schools in the WSFCS district. 25 meals were taken to South Fork. Thank you to all who participated in this project in prayer, time, or financially.

In December we provided food, perishable and

non-perishable for 30 families from South Fork. The scholars were not in school from December 16th until January 3rd, so our food bags provided food beyond a traditional Christmas meal to help fill the gap where no school meals were provided. Sponsors provided gifts including toys and clothing for 30 scholars and 11 of their preschool siblings. Thank you to all

who sponsored a scholar and to those who contributed financially so that my "secret shoppers" could purchase gifts to cover the siblings. On December 12th the library was bursting with 41 huge boxes of gifts!!Stockings were filled by Valerie Crane, Janet Gardner, Denise Hunt, Carol Crooks, and Bill and Marla Sparks. On December

the "trucks and drivers of the New Friendship Class" and many, many other volunteers as the caravan moved the gifts and food bags to South Fork. You could feel Jesus' love in each volunteer as they worked together to get everything ready for the 30 families that we sponsored. I wish each of you could have witnessed this event!! The

true meaning of Christmas was felt by all of the volunteers. Thank you to all who participated in this project.

Each month treats are provided for the faculty and staff at South Fork and for our preschool staff. Both places are grateful for the kindness and ap-





preciation that New Philadelphia shows them.


Coming up soon: TOOTHBRUSH and TOOTH-PASTE for all of the scholars at South Fork. This project will run from January 29th until February 16th.

Building faith through Reflection and Art ... A Lenten Guide

That's the title of New Philadelphia's 2024 Devotion Guide and as its title hints, there are some changes in this year's project. They include:

Change #1:

In the past, we have relied on the Moravian Daily Text to provide the scripture passages for our reflections. This year, we have assembled verses and passages that reflect seven categories or themes found throughout the Bible and that are common to the human experience. They are: Betrayal; Condemnation; Humiliation; Physical and Mental Suffering; Forsakenness/Abandonment; Forgiveness; Conversion. These themes were also found in Jesus' life, and were deepened in His last hours on earth.

Change #2:

This year's Guide will be spiral-bound for ease in reading and note-taking. Each theme's section will conclude with questions for your personal reflections and space to write the answers.

Change #3:

Famous paintings will accompany our reflections, enhancing the devotion themes and our personal journeys. Through art we may hear God's voice anew.

Change #4:

Lastly, each devotion will be marked chronologically but without a date so that the Guides can be easily used in other years or for purposes beyond Lent.

This year's format and the work each writer brings to the project will guide us through the season and will, we pray, make the time we spend with the One who journeyed to the cross more meaningful.

The Guides will be distributed on Sunday, February 11th to prepare you for Ash Wednesday on the 14th
